





(\$ in billions, constant 2005 dollars)




MAJOR COMPONENTS OF THE BUDGET








SPENDING RESTRAINT - DEFICIT REDUCTION - BUDGET ENFORCEMENT - FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Reinstates Statutory Caps on Discretionary Spending**
- 2. Creates Commission on Entitlement Solvency**
- 3. Reduces Deficit as % of GDP Through Reconciliation**
- 4. Improves Line-Item Veto/Expedited Rescission Process**
- 5. Legislates Medicare Trigger in Senate Budget Resolution**
- 6. Creates Commission on Accountability & Review**
- 7. Includes Biennial Budgeting**
- 8. Reforms of Budget Resolution & Reconciliation Processes**
