#### **WITNESSES**

"Air pollution impacts from wildfire will continue to undermine hard fought gains in western air quality. The air in the west has been getting worse since 2016 and this trend will continue.

The public health costs of wildfire air pollution are likely as high, if not higher than the value of structure losses. Impacts are highest for seniors, kids, pregnant women and people with asthma. These costs will grow as a share of Medicare and overall costs."




